1 THE WITNESS: Okay. 2 THE COURT: Okay. 3 THE WITNESS: Uh-huh. 4 THE COURT: Now, after Mr. Brown is done asking you his 5 questions, Mr. Walsh is going to have a chance to ask you some questions. Well, same thing, if you could wait until he's done 6 asking the question before you answer. Yes or no if the answer calls for it. And if you don't understand what he's getting at, let him know and he will re-ask the question. Okay? 10 THE WITNESS: Okay. 11 THE COURT: Ready to get started? 12 THE WITNESS: Yeah. 13 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Brown? 14 MR. BROWN: Thank you, your Honor. 15 HOLLY SWANSON, 16 called as a witness by and on behalf of the Defense, having 17 been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows: 18 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BROWN: 19 20 Good afternoon, ma'am. 0. 21 Α. Good afternoon. 22 Q. I'm sorry to have to ask you these questions, and I 23 apologize for meeting you under these circumstances, but I have to ask you some of these, and I hope you understand that. 24 25 Yeah? 26 I'm sorry, I couldn't even hear you. 27 I'm sorry I have to meet you under these circumstances 0. 28 and to ask you the questions that I'm about to ask you.

1 Α. Uh-huh. 2 But I would like to move forward with this quickly, if you don't mind? 4 Α. Absolutely. 5 THE COURT: Ms. Swanson, you may want to pull your 6 microphone down a little bit. 7 (A DISCUSSION WAS HELD OFF THE RECORD.) 8 THE COURT: Mr. Brown? 9 MR. BROWN: Thank you. 10 Q. (By Mr. Brown:) And if you don't hear me --11 Α. I can hear you now. 12 0. All right. Sorry about that. Sometimes I talk awfully 13 soft. 14 Would you tell the jury please who you are. 15 Α. I'm Kerianne Bradley's aunt. And would that make you the sister of Jennifer Bradley? 16 Q. 17 Α. Yes, it would. 18 0. And would that also make you the daughter of Denise 19 Pou? 20 Yes, it would. Α. 21 Now, I wanted to get right to the gist of this. 22 wanted to talk with you about some of the comments that you made to an Officer Haddad when he interviewed you. Okay? Just so 24 you understand where I am. All right? 25 Α. Okay. 26 Now, I understand that you had advised Mr. Haddad that you and your mother had become involved in Kerianne's life. 28 you recall telling him that?

1 Α. Yes. 2 Do you recall telling Officer Haddad why you and Okay. your mother had become involved or very involved in Kerianne's life? 5 Α. Yes. 6 Q. Would you tell us why you and your mother had become involved in Kerianne's life, please? Jennifer asked my mom for help with Kerianne, and I was 8 Α. asked by my mom to help pick Kerianne up from the baby-sitter's 10 about twice a week and to have her at my house until my mom was 11 able to get off work, because my daughter had a babysitter right 12 next door to Kerianne's babysitter. 13 Do you recall telling Detective Haddad that you and your mother became involved in Kerianne's life since she was 15 born because Jennifer had been so neglectful? 16 Α. I don't recall those words. 17 MR. BROWN: Do you have a clean copy of the --18 (DEFENSE COUNSEL CONFER.) 19 Q. (By Mr. Brown:) I'm going to show you the report 20 prepared by Detective Haddad. 21 Α. Uh-huh. Q. Direct your attention to the third sentence of the first paragraph, please. 23 24 Α. I see what's there, yes. 25 Does that refresh your recollection as to what you told Detective Haddad as to why you and your mother became so involved in Kerianne's life? 28 Α. No.

1 All right. Do you recall Detective Haddad asking you whether or not Jennifer was somewhat neglectful towards Kerianne? Can you repeat that? 5 Yes. Do you recall whether or not Detective Haddad had 6 asked you whether or not Jennifer was somewhat neglectful to 7 Kerianne? I don't recall our conversation exactly, because it's been four years. I don't recall the exact word-for-word conversation. 10 0. Do you recall Detective Haddad generally asking you if Jennifer was somewhat neglectful towards Kerianne? 13 I -- I don't recall him asking me those questions. 14 Do you recall telling Detective Haddad -- or strike 0. 15 that, please. 16 Do you recall correcting Officer Haddad and saying that 17 Jennifer was very neglectful? 18 MR. WALSH: Your Honor, I'm going to object and cite 19 the hearing we had before lunch. 20 THE COURT: Sustained. 21 You don't have to answer that. 22 THE WITNESS: Thank you. 23 (By Mr. Brown:) Do you know of an occasion where Jennifer refused to take Kerianne to a doctor? 24 25 Α. No. 2.6 Did you tell Detective Haddad that Jennifer had refused 27 to take Kerianne to see a doctor when she was sick? 28 I remember telling Detective Haddad that I took Α.

1 Kerianne to the doctor.

One of the first questions he asked you about was the point in time when Jennifer asked you and Denise to become a part of Kerianne's life. Do you remember Mr. Brown 10 asking you about that just now? 11 Α. Yes. 12 And you -- you know your sister pretty well, I would a 0. 13 assume? 14 Α. Yes. 28 And in fact, when Jennifer asked yourself and your

1 mother for help with Kerianne, it was because she -- she 2 explained she wasn't able to juggle a job and keeping Kerianne on a schedule and all those things; isn't that right? That's exactly right. 5 0. And the time that you had this interview with Detective 6 Haddad, this was -- this is back in February of '06; isn't that 7 right? 8 Α. Yes. And your first conversation with Detective Haddad was 10 at the hospital in San Diego, was it not? 11 Α. Yes. And when in time -- were you at the hospital in 0. San Diego when Kerianne passed away? 14 Α. Yes, I was. 15 And when in time did Detective Haddad speak to you in 0. regard to when Kerianne passed away? 17 Α. Hours. 18 Within hours of her passing away? 19 Α. (Nods head.) Yes. 20 0. Okay. Thank you. 21 The -- do you have children of your own? 22 Α. Yes. 23 And is -- would you say that the way you care for your children is different than the way that Jennifer cared for 25 Kerianne? 26 Α. Yes. 27 When Jennifer asked you and your mother for help with Q. Kerianne, were you and your mother able to help her with

## 1 Kerianne? 2 Α. Yes. 3 And then that involved doing some of the things that Jennifer didn't have time to do, like taking Kerianne to the 5 doctor? 6 Α. Yes. 7 Providing prescriptions for Kerianne? 8 Α. Yes. Actually taking care of Kerianne during times that Jennifer could not be with her? 11 Α. Yes. 12 And so were there times during your relationship with 13 Jennifer while she had Kerianne that she did say -- Mr. Brown 14 asked you about some specific statements that Detective Haddad 15 recorded in his police report about things that you heard 16 Jennifer say about Kerianne. Is it fair to say that Jennifer at 17 times during Kerianne's life had negative things to say about Kerianne? 18 19 Α. Yes. 20 Did Jennifer say things to the effect of, Kerianne was 21 an inconvenience on her life? 22 Α. To that effect, yes. 23 Okay. Okay. Thank you. 24 MR. WALSH: I don't have any other questions for you, 25 Ms. Swanson. Thank you. 26 THE COURT: Thank you, Mr. Walsh. 27 Mr. Brown, any follow-up? 28 MR. BROWN: No, sir. Thank you.
