







Dear Ms. Comstedt,

I am a CALPIA Industrial Supervisor for the General Facilities Maintenance & Repair (GFMR) program at Richard J. Donovan Correctional Facility (RJDCF) in San Diego, CA. I am writing this letter in support of Ryan Mickey, one of the offender employees in our program.

GFMR is a new CALPIA Career Technical Education (CTE) program implemented at several institutions throughout California, including RJDCF. Its purpose is to train workers in facilities maintenance & repair trades such as framing, drywall, electrical, flooring, and other building professions in order to teach them marketable skills with which they can obtain gainful employment after their return to the community.

Over 100 offenders submitted applications upon program implementation. From these, I selected and conducted approximately 30 interviews. I interviewed Mr. Mickey, and he was one of the first new hires for only six positions in the program. I selected him because of his specific, concrete goals for self-improvement and his plans to succeed and become a productive member of society after his release from prison.

Mr. Mickey also stood out from among the men I interviewed because of his prior knowledge and experience in the electrical field.

After his employment began, I asked him to help train his fellow employees to understand the principles of electricity and to perform electrical wiring. He has demonstrated considerable skill in constructing a training board to aid in teaching his co-workers. He demonstrated how to perform the appropriate calculations and demonstrate how to bend, measure, and install electrical conduit and components as well as how to follow the relevant electrical codes and ensure proper safety practices are observed when working with electricity. He also took it upon himself to create diagrams depicting different calculations and formulas for transformers, circuitry, and conduit bending. He is an excellent teacher, and his work and work ethic would qualify him not only as a lead person on any job site, but also as a supervisor.

I appreciate the time you have taken to read and consider my letter. I truly believe that Mr. Mickey will be an asset to any employer who would consider hiring him. I think he has much to



Inmate, Ryan Mickey's, skills as an Electrician are an asset to this institution. During his time as an employee at the "Central Energy Plant", he performed duties that helped maintain the plant's operation. The turbines cooling fan had been tripping after 5 to 7 hours of operation. This had been occurring for roughly a year, inmate Mickey, trouble shot the problem and actually fixed it. Another problem occurred with the turbine that caused it to shut down. Mickey, identified that problem as well, and was able to bypass the float switch in the turbine's oil tank and allowed the turbine to continue normal operation. He took it upon himself to build a charging station for maintenance and supervisors carts. He installed emergency exit signs in the switch gear. He removed old lights from the back up generator and reinstalled new ones adding an additional two fixtures on a clean 45° prefabbed rack. His conduit bending skills are amazing (emt/rigid). The ice machine at the plant had stopped working and Mickey, was able to locate the problem and fix it as well. Inmate Mickey, is an exceptional electrician. He has a great attitude, take pride in his work and all his work is done to code.


